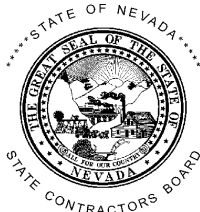

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MINUTES OF THE WORKSHOP AND HEARING BEFORE THE NEVADA STATE CONTRACTORS BOARD HELD MARCH 28, 2003

The workshop was called to order at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, March 28, 2003, at the offices of the State Contractors Board, 9670 Gateway Drive, Reno, Nevada 89521. Exhibit 1 is the Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation and a copy of the proposed regulation.

Ms. Grein called the workshop to order and explained the purpose of the workshop is to received public comment on the proposed regulation to amend Chapter 624 of the Nevada Administrative Code to establish a subclassification to the solar contracting classification for the installation of photovoltaics and in addition, add a fee for reviewing an application that is filed with the Board pursuant to an entity conversion. Ms. Grein indicated that the notice of the workshop had been posted in compliance with NRS 233B at the Las Vegas City Hall, the Sawyer State Building, Clark County Library, Washoe County Courthouse, Washoe County Library, Reno City Hall and the offices of the State Contractors Board in Reno and Henderson.

Ms. Grein stated that the regulation would be adopted as a temporary regulation and another workshop and hearing would be held after the conclusion of the legislative session before the regulation could be adopted as permanent.

There were no members of the public to offer comments on the proposed temporary regulation. The workshop was adjourned at 10:12 a.m.

The hearing was called to order at 10:15 a.m. Ms. Grein stated that no comments were received at the workshop and therefore the regulation as written would be placed on the Board's agenda for adoption as a temporary regulation.
