CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION
AGAINST FOUR CONTRACTORS

(Reno, NV) - At its meeting on March 9, 2004, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against four (4) licensed contractors.

Light Gauge Wall Systems, license number 44884A (Lathing & Plastering) based out of Carson City, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to keep in force a bond or cash deposit. The Board revoked the license of Light Gauge Wall Systems.

Greenlaw Roofing, license number 47892 (Roofing/Insulation) of Fernley, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for abandonment of a construction project; failure to comply with the terms of a contract or written warranty; failure to comply with a notice to correct; a fraudulent or deceitful act committed in the capacity of a contractor; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The Board revoked the license of Greenlaw Roofing.

Build With You Construction, license number 43690 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Gardnerville, NV was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with a notice to correct; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; failure to provide required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures; failure to provide disclosures required by a general contractor; failure to pay a required assessment; misrepresentation of a material fact; and acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license. The licensee was fined \$2,900 and assessed the cost of investigation.

Summary Suspension

JK Construction, license number 43690 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Fernley, Nevada, was summarily suspended by the Nevada State Contractors Board for the health, safety and welfare of the public.

The Board acted under a provision of the Nevada revised Statutes (NRS) 624.291, which gives the Board authority to suspend the license of a contractor without a hearing if the board finds, based upon evidence in its possession, that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires summary suspension of the license.

Summary Suspension

Distinctive General Contracting, license number 45304 (Residential and Small Commercial) and 51595 (Carpentry) based out of North Las Vegas, Nevada was summarily suspended by the Nevada State Contractors Board for the health, safety and welfare of the public.

The Board acted under a provision of the Nevada revised Statutes (NRS) 624.291, which gives the Board authority to suspend the license of a contractor without a hearing if the board finds, based upon evidence in its possession, that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires summary suspension of the license.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
