CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION INVOLVING THREE CONTRACTORS

(Reno, NV) - At its meeting on August 10, 2004, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against three (3) licensed contractors.

Fiori Corporation, license numbers 20135 (Sheet Metal, Heating, Cooling, Circulation) and 20720 (Roofing, Siding and Waterproofing) based out of Reno, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to provide required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures; and failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal. The licensee was fined \$1000 and assessed the cost of investigation.

Hamlin Development, license numbers 47827 (Residential and Small Commercial) and 47827A (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Reno, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to comply with a notice to correct; bidding or contracting in excess of established license limit; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; failure to provide disclosures required by a general building contractor; combining or conspiring with an unlicensed person to commit an unauthorized act; and failure to ascertain that each person that bids on a contract is properly licensed. The licensee was fined \$1500 and assessed the cost of investigation.

S & S Roofing, license number 41123 (Roofing) based out of Elko, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with a notice to correct; willful disregard of building laws; contracting in excess of established license limit; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The Board revoked the license of S&S Roofing.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
