NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Workshop and Hearing for the Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations of

The State of Nevada Contractors Board LCB File R018-14 and R019-14

The State of Nevada Contractors Board (Board) will conduct a public workshop on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 30, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. and a public hearing on Thursday, May 15, 2014 at 9:00 a.m.</u> The workshop and hearing will be video-conferenced between the Board's Henderson office located at 2310 Corporate Circle, Suite 200, Henderson, Nevada 89074 and the Reno office located at 9670 Gateway Drive, Suite 100, Reno, Nevada, 89521.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.060 and 233B.0603:

- 1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment. The purpose of proposed regulations is to amend Chapter 624 of the Nevada Administrative Code relating to classification C-10 and the imposition of administrative fines.
- 2. Either the terms or the substance of the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed or a description of the subjects and issues involved.

The proposed regulation R018-14 amends the current C-10 Landscape classification to include tree trimming and removal of trees and tree stumps. Proposed regulation R019-14 modifies NAC 624.7251 to include standards used in the imposition of administrative fines for all violations of NRS 624. 3. The estimated economic effect of this proposed regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public.

(a) Adverse and beneficial effects.

The adoption of proposed regulation R018-14 may result in an economic impact on those businesses that may be required to obtain licensure. The regulation should not result in any adverse economic effect on the general public. The adoption of proposed regulation R019-14 should not have any economic effect since it simply standardizes language already in statute.

(b) Both immediate and long-term effects.

The immediate and long term effect of implementing the provisions of R018-14 would require licensure for those individuals performing tree trimming and removal of trees and tree stumps and should be beneficial to the public since licensees are required to comply with safety and insurance requirements. R019-14 provides standards used in the imposition of fines for all violations of NRS 624 and should not have significant immediate or long-term effects.

4. The estimated cost to the agency for the enforcement of the proposed regulation. Cost to the agency should be minimal.

5. A description of and citation to any regulations of other states or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication and overlapping is necessary. The proposed regulation does not overlap or duplicate any regulation.

If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the board may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

A copy of this notice and the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed will be on file at the State Library, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notices and the regulation to be adopted will be available at the State Contractors Board 2310 Corporate Circle, Suite 200, Henderson, Nevada 89074 and the Reno office located at 9670 Gateway Drive, Suite 100, Reno, Nevada, 89521. In all counties in which an office of the Board is not maintained, a copy of this notice and the text of the proposed regulation will also be available for public inspection and copying at the main public library during business hours. This notice and the text of the proposed regulation will be available in the State of Nevada Register of Administrative Regulations, which is prepared and published monthly by the Legislative Counsel Bureau pursuant to NRS 233B.0653, and on the Internet at <u>www.leg.state.nv.us</u>. Copies of this notice and the proposed regulation will also be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if deemed necessary.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the board, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.
