MINUTES OF THE HEARING BEFORE THE
NEVADA STATE CONTRACTORS' BOARD
HELD NOVEMBER 28, 2000

The hearing was called to order at 10:05 p.m. on Tuesday, November 28, 2000, at the offices of the State Contractors' Board, 4220 South Maryland Parkway, Las Vegas, Nevada 89119. Exhibit A is the Notice of Intent to Adopt and a copy of the Proposed Rule.

Ms. Grein explained the purpose of the hearing is to consider proposed changes to NAC Chapter 624 concerning qualifications of investigators employed by the Board. She indicated that the notice of the hearing was posted in compliance with NRS 233B on October 26, 2000 at the Las Vegas City Hall, the Sawyer State Building, Clark County Library, Washoe County Courthouse, Washoe County Library, Reno City Hall and offices of the State Contractors' Board in Reno and Las Vegas.

Ms. Grein indicated that the proposed amendments to NAC 624 are needed to comply with legislative mandates concerning the establishment of an investigations office and the qualifications for investigators employed to carry out the provisions of the statute.

The proposed regulation establishes the qualifications required to be employed by the Nevada State Contractors' Board in the capacity of a compliance investigator or a criminal investigator.

It was noted that the time for the hearing was posted for 10:00 a.m. and no members of the public were in attendance.

Mr. Gregory noted that the regulation should provide the agency flexibility in determining the best qualified candidate for the investigative positions. It is his opinion that the regulation as originally drafted provides the most flexibility to the agency.

The hearing was adjourned at 10:37 a.m.
