

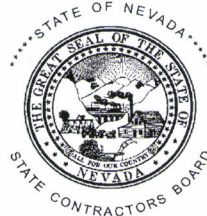

December 19, 2017

ALJ Allison found Respondent guilty one (1) violation of NRS 624.3013(3) failure to keep records for a period of not less than 3 years after the completion of any construction project to which the records refer and one (1) violation of NRS 624.302(6) failure to comply with a written request by the Board. The Six, Seventh, Ninth and Tenth Causes of Action were dismissed. The First, Fourth, Fifth, Eighth, Eleventh, Twelfth and Thirteenth Causes of Action were held in abeyance until May 23, 2018. Respondent was assessed a fine of \$500.00 for the Second Cause of Action; a fine of \$2,500.00 for the Third Cause of Action for total fines of \$3,000.00 and investigative costs of \$19,069.00.
