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BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST TWO LICENSED CONTRACTORS

(Reno, NV) – At its meeting on August 5, 2003 the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against two (2) licensed contractors.

Excel Builders and Development, license number 48770 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Reno, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with a notice to correct; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license; failure to obtain a necessary building permit; and failure to provide Residential Recovery Fund disclosures. The Board revoked the license of Excel Builders and Development.

Sapper Construction, license number 19645 (General Engineering) based out of Spring Valley, California was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to pay for materials and services; failure to cooperate in the investigation of a complaint; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The Board revoked the license of Sapper Construction.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

The Board will convene next in Henderson, NV on August 19, 2003.

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
