**NSCB Investigators Cite Two Contractors  
For Alleged Unlicensed Activity**

Nevada State Contractors Board investigators conducted a sting operation Jan. 23, 2009, in the northwest area of Las Vegas for alleged unlicensed contracting activity.

Those who received criminal citations and ordered to appear in court for allegedly *contracting without a license* by submitting bids were:

**Antonio Ojeda**, dba Intensive Electric, submitted a *bid for electrical work*, and **Lloyd Pacheco**, dba America's Best Grout & Tile Cleaning Service, submitted a *bid for electrical work*.

Contracting without a license in Nevada is a misdemeanor for the first offense, a gross misdemeanor for the second offense and a Class E felony for the third offense.

Homeowners who use unlicensed contractors are not eligible for the Residential Recovery Fund, and by law their contracts are null and void.

The NSCB recommends that homeowners not use unlicensed contractors because

their work is generally poor quality, they are often uninsured and may not maintain Workman's compensation coverage for their employees, and the homeowner may be liable for all injuries to workers.
