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CONTRACTORS DISCIPLINED BY BOARD IN DECEMBER

RENO and HENDERSON, Nev. – The Nevada State Contractors Board took disciplinary action against licensed contractors for violations of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 624 during its December hearings.

CNS Construction, license number 48077 (residential and small commercial) based out of Las Vegas, Nev., was found in violation for willful disregard of safety or labor laws, failure to establish financial responsibility and failure to comply with a written request of the Board. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$1,750 and assessed investigative costs.

Carrasco Concrete, Inc., license number 50876 (concrete) based out of Searchlight, Nev., was found in violation for disregard of safety or labor laws, failure to establish financial responsibility and failure to comply with Board regulations. The monetary limit of the license was reduced to \$700,000. Licensee was fined \$1,500 and assessed investigative costs. If the terms of the decision and order are not complied with by January 8, 2020, the license will be revoked.

Spike Construction, Inc., license numbers 59148 (residential and small commercial) and 62942 (masonry) based out of Las Vegas, Nev., were suspended pending a hearing scheduled for February 19, 2020.

Solcius, LLC, license number 83183 (electrical) based out of Provo, Utah, was found in violation for failure to include the monetary limit on a bid or contract. Licensee was fined \$100 and assessed investigative costs.

Mechanical Technologies Corp., dba Alpine Air license number 50884 (refrigeration and air conditioning) based out of Campbell, Calif., was found in violation for failure to establish financial responsibility and failure to comply with a written request from the Board. The license was suspended. Licensee was fined \$2,000 and assessed investigative costs.

Ranger Construction, license number 66473 (residential and small commercial) based out of Reno, Nev., was found in violation for failure to establish financial responsibility and failure to respond to a written request

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by the Board. Licensee was fined \$3,000 and assessed investigative costs. Licensee is required to post performance bonds on all open contracts and is not permitted to enter into new contracts. Licensee must provide a compliant financial statement to the Board by January 24, 2020 or the license will be revoked.

Got Paint, LLC, dba Paint N More license number 78395 (painting and decorating) based out of Henderson, Nev., was found in violation for bidding or contracting on a construction contract in excess of the limit placed on its license. Licensee was fined \$1,000 and assessed investigative costs.

Island Springs, LLC license number 68840 (maintenance and repair of pools and spas) based out of Las Vegas, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to take appropriate corrective action, failure to include Residential Recovery Fund information in a contract or proposal, failure to include the monetary license limit or license number on a contract or proposal, failure to comply with a written request from the Board and acting as a contractor without possessing the required license. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$7,000 and assessed investigative costs.

APEC Consultants, Inc., dba Fab Construction, license numbers 68161 (general building), 75618 (general engineering) and 83885 (covering floors, plastic tile and wallboard) and **APEC Consultants, Inc.**, license number 80366 (tiling) based out of Las Vegas, Nev., were found in violation for failure to pay for materials or services rendered. The licenses were revoked. Licensee was fined \$5,000 and assessed investigative costs.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

NRS 624.212(7) allows an unlicensed individual who was issued a cease and desist order to petition the Board in writing to lift or alter the order within 15 days after receiving the cease and desist order. Upon receipt of this request, the Board will schedule an administrative hearing to review the facts and make a determination on the validity of the cease and desist order and assess any fines or costs that may be associated with the investigation.

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
